**WARNING : FROM THE 1ST OF AUGUST, AMERICAN CREW MEMBERS WILL NO LONGER NEED A PROFESSIONAL VISA FOR FRANCE.** Consequently this section non longer applies for american crew members, but only to crew members whose nationality is submitted to the short stay visa for France.

You have to apply with the French Consulate in Houston, only if you reside in one of the following states : Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma and Louisiana.

If you do not reside in one of those states, you have to apply with another French Consulate, depending on where you live in the United states. To know where to apply, [click here](#). American citizens, crew members, have to get a visa to be able to go to France, on duty.

### REQUIREMENTS :

You have to apply with all the required documents. The visa section does not make any copies.

- ▶ Passport valid for a period of three months beyond the applicant's last day of stay in the Schengen states, though it is advisable that your passport be valid for more than 15 months. Please make sure your passport has a double blank page to affix the visa.
- ▶ 1 **short stay application form** completely and legibly filled out. Please print in black. Indicate also your phone numbers and e-mail.
- ▶ 1 [recent passport size photograph](#). DO NOT GLUE to the form.
- ▶ A letter from your airline company, with your name, date of birth and position within the company (bring the original of the letter).
- ▶ A copy of your crew member ID and of the first page of your passport.
- ▶ [Processing fees](#): **by cash or money-order only**.
